

Investment Committee News

The first meeting of the investment committee happened on January 17th at approximately 8:30 PM. After notices went out, we had 5 men in attendance. Anyone is welcome to express their opinion, whether it be at the previous or a future regular business or special investment meeting. The basics decided at this meeting were to set aside scholarships for five needy area Catholic high schools, invest some money in a charity account and invest the rest in a fund for council expenses going forth into the future. Scholarships will be awarded this year, if possible, and if we receive all the information from the selected high schools; and if the stipulations we have set are all met by these schools. Any money donated will go directly to each of the 5 schools and be earmarked as a Notre Dame #2901 K of C scholarship fund.

Only dividends from money invested for either the charity or council expenses, will be spent yearly. Money spent from either account will be subject to rules set in our by-laws. Miscellaneous charities that come up during the fiscal year, such as our Tunnels to Towers donation, and others, which were not earmarked in our budget, may have funding taken from this interest bearing account. Likewise, miscellaneous council expenses that arise, may be taken from the council interest bearing account. The investment vehicle for these two accounts has not been chosen and will be investigated in future investment meetings. This is not our most pressing issue as the money is safely invested in a money market account presently.

Money amounts and listed high schools will not be discussed via this newsletter so not to generate social media rants. It is in your best interest to attend a regular business or special investment meeting, if you wish the details or a vote into the investments. All members have a voice in this matter, if you desire. A motion will be requested after a report is made from the investment committee on February 7th at the 7:30PM regular business meeting. At the following regular business meeting on March 7th. at 7:30 PM discussion, seconding and voting will be held. If you have any opinion, now is your chance to vote. I realize that some may not get this Grotto until after the February meeting, since US Mail may be slow and the Grotto does not mail until February 10th at the earliest. We will take this into consideration at the March meeting, and list the report once again so all have a chance to digest it and make a decision. We will send this same information out in an email along with the meeting notice, and publish this on our web site.


Financial Secretary Report

By the time you read this Grotto, we will be in the last (March) mailing of assessments (dues), which is known as the "Notice to Retain". This used to be the "Notice to suspend", in the old days, but retain seems to be a nicer way to put it. Brothers, for any of you who still have not sent in your dues, or attended a meeting this last year, or even helped out a one of our charitable events, this mailing was the last one we will be sending out. And in parallel with these dues reminders, we will be trying to contact any of you who we haven't either heard from or seen in the last year, via our retention committee. Believe me when I say, we don't want to throw anyone out who wants to still be a knight! The paperwork is a mess for us but consider this, we are paying the per capita for every member, to the State and Supreme Councils, out of our treasury, whether you pay your dues or not. It amounts to quite a bit of money, so after at least two years, if we can't contact you or receive any dues payments, we have no other resort but to process a suspension. This is why I print out on every dues mailing, the fact that you can contact us with any hardship problems, whether it be financial, health, job etc. and we can help. And if you really, really don't want anything to do with the knights, just send me a signed and dated note to this effect and you will not be pestered by us anymore. It is the easiest way out! But, we will miss you. And you can always come back! Maybe when you retire, you will have more time to devote to charity and the knights. We, hopefully, and God willing, will be there for you. Our membership is getting older, there is considerable attrition due to age itself, and those members who have been a knight for a long time are Honorary Life members who do not have to pay dues at all. For our council to survive, we need new and young men to carry on our tradition of 79 years, and we hope to make it to 100 years as a council. Just as an example, there are 24 councils out of 145 in Maryland that have reached the century milestone. And out of all of these councils, Notre Dame is the 29th oldest in the state. We have until 2044, only 21 more years, to make it to the century mark. We can only make it with young men and new members. The council we split from, Santa Maria, was an old but vibrant council. But it died a few years ago. Lets not let this happen to us!
